

KETO LEMON BARS

INGREDIENTS

FOR THE CRUST

Cooking spray

2 c. almond flour

1/4 c. Swerve confectioners' sugar sweetener

1/4 tsp. kosher salt

1/2 c. (1 stick) melted butter

FOR THE FILLING

4 large eggs

1/3 c. sour cream

1/2 c. lemon juice

2 tsp. lemon zest

1 tsp. pure vanilla extract

1/2 c. almond flour

1/2 c. Swerve confectioners' sugar sweetener, plus more for topping

DIRECTIONS

- Make crust: Preheat oven to 350° and line a 9"-x-9" baking pan with parchment paper and grease with cooking spray. In a large bowl, whisk together almond flour, Swerve, and salt. Add melted butter and stir to combine.
- 2 Press mixture into prepared pan in an even layer and bake until lightly golden, 15 minutes.
- Make filling: In a another large bowl, combine eggs, sour cream, lemon juice, zest, and vanilla. Add almond flour and Swerve, and whisk to incorporate.
- 4 Pour filling over crust and bake until filling is just set, 15 minutes. Let cool to room temp, then refrigerate until set, about 2 hours.
- **5** When ready to serve, cut into squares and dust with Swerve, if desired.
